Sukanya secured the Director's Merit List Award in her first year at IIMB. During the 7th term, she pursued the International Student Program at the University of St. Gallen, Switzerland, which is designed exclusively for international participants. This program offers major insights into European business models, leadership styles and includes visits to leading international organizations such as the UN, CERN, etc.

Sukanya organized a panel discussion on 'Dealing with Technological Disruption' for Drishti, the PGPEM flagship event, in 2019, with featured eminent speakers from various sectors like Government, healthcare and industry.
